HOW TO SEARCH FOR QUALITATIVE STUDIES

1. Do an Advanced Search.
 2. On the first line put your string of synonyms for your thesis topic. For example:
liberalisation or liberalization or privatisation or privatization or deregulation
 3. On the second line, search in the Abstract for:
qualitative or interview or interviewing or focus group or content analysis
- This method is not perfect because some qualitative studies will not use these words.

HOW TO SEARCH FOR QUANTITATIVE STUDIES

1. Do an Advanced Search.
 2. On the first line put your string of synonyms for your thesis topic. For example:
liberalisation or liberalization or privatisation or privatization or deregulation
 3. On the second line, search in the Abstract for:
quantitative or survey or surveys or questionnaires or interview or interviewing

HOW TO SEARCH FOR SUNYIT THESES

Using the "SUNYIT Catalog," do a "Word(s) Anywhere" search for "thesis suny" -- without the quotes. You should receive about 226 results. Theses are shelved by call number on the second floor of the library and are available for issuing / borrowing.

Since almost all SUNYIT theses look the same you can also find them by browsing the shelves of your subject area, e.g., computer science: QA; telecom: TK.
